Campus Housing

To be eligible for campus housing, students must:

- Be enrolled as a full-time student at EMCC (12+ credits per semester);
- Have a completed FAFSA and any documentation needed to process financial aid on file with EMCC OR have submitted proof of third-party funding to cover expenses;
- Pay a \$100 Housing Deposit or request a waiver of the deposit from the Residential Life Department;
- Clear a criminal background screening. (Convictions and/or arrests which may impede housing eligibility include, but are not limited to: theft, arson, drugs, or violence. Individuals seeking clarification should contact the Director of Residential Life prior to submitting an application for housing);
- Maintain a GPA of 2.0 or higher (incoming students are exempt from this requirement);
- Agree to abide by all EMCC policies and procedures including, but not limited to: the EMCC Civility Statement, Code of Conduct, and Chemical-Free policies;
- Submit immunization records to the Enrollment Center as required by Maine State law;
- Have no outstanding balance with EMCC and agree to make payment arrangements for all charges (room, board, tuition & fees) prior to moving onto campus.

To apply for campus housing, complete your Housing Application and return it with your \$100 Housing Deposit to *The Residential Life Department*, 354 Hogan Road, Bangor, ME 04401. Check or money orders should be payable to Eastern Maine Community College. Deposits can also be paid by calling the EMCC Business Office at (207) 974-4630 and using a credit/debit card.

If you do not meet the above requirements or cannot pay the required deposit, but would like to be considered for campus housing, please draft a statement and submit it along with your Housing Application. Your statement can also be emailed to <u>housing@emcc.edu</u>.

<u>There is no deadline to apply for campus housing; however, space does fill quickly.</u> Deposits are <u>non-refundable sixty days</u> before the start of the semester (July 1st for Fall applicants and December 1st for Spring). Written notification <u>by the student</u> must be made to the <u>Residential Life Department</u> in order for any refund to be issued.
