Outdoor Recreation and Tourism

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION



Let nature be your classroom! The outdoors is filled with career opportunities for the student seeking an active outdoor lifestyle and career. With a heavy emphasis on field based learning, the EMCC Outdoor Recreation and Tourism program prepares students for entry level positions in adventure travel, environmental education, outdoor leadership, wilderness therapy, guiding and wilderness park operations.

The associate in applied science degree in Outdoor Recreation and Tourism program, based in Maine's Katahdin Region, will give students the skills, proficiency, and knowledge needed for successful guiding and outfitting of outdoor excursions and park operations as well as a mastery of principles in management and customer service. The EMCC curriculum emphasizes:

- **Backcountry travel.** Students will gain proficiency at both summer and winter human powered travel and camping in the challenging environment of northern New England. Sample topics include backpacking, Leave No Trace skills, flat and whitewater canoeing and kayaking, shelter, navigation, use of fire and camp stoves, rock climbing, winter mountaineering, weather forecasting, leadership development and expedition leadership.
- Environmental Education / Wilderness Ethics. Now more than ever we need outdoor professionals who understand the importance of natural areas. Explore a variety of ecosystems including coastal; forests; streams, rivers and lakes; and above tree line and delve into the environmental philosophy.
- Management, Marketing and Customer Service. Taking people outdoors is the fun part. Attention to business matters is needed make that happen. Courses emphasize practical skills such as designing brochures, drafting press releases, using social media and solving real life customer service dilemmas.
- **Backcountry Risk Management** is woven into nearly every class and specifically includes courses in wilderness medicine, search and rescue, equipment repair and avalanche awareness.
- Winter Outdoor Recreation with a focus on human powered activities such as Nordic skiing, camping, snowshoeing, ice climbing and winter mountaineering. Students also learn about snowmobile operations.
- Park Operations. Ideal preparation for entry positions includes trail and shelter construction, chain saw operations, campsite operations, mechanical tool use and park planning needs.


