

## ON COURSE FOR COLLEGE APPLICATION

### **Guidelines:**

- 1) The program is available in the fall, spring and summer semesters.
- 2) Funding is for enrollment in general education courses at the 100-level or above.
- 3) Scholarships are considered on a "seat available" basis; no seat, section or course is guaranteed.
- 4) Not more than 6 credits maximum each semester collectively at all participating Maine colleges/universities.
- 5) Obtaining transcripts, posting grades to a high school and other academic tasks are the student's responsibility.

### **Student Qualifications:**

- Must be a current high school junior or senior enrolled in a public or publically funded high school, or be home schooled
- Must have a high school average grade of at least a B

**STUDENT** – Print neatly; and all fields are required

- Must satisfy all pre and co-requisites for the course in which the student seeks to enroll
- Must obtain all necessary high school, parental and other appropriate approvals

#### **PAYMENT OF FEES**

Students receive a scholarship for 100% of the cost of tuition and *most* applicable fees (*some exclusions apply*). Students are responsible for the purchase of the book(s) and materials. In the event that *service* fees are required for a course, students will not be registered for that course until payment of the service fee is received.
