Human Services—Substance Abuse Rehabilitation Technician



PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

This Human Services degree program focuses on the knowledge and skills required to work in today's diverse field of Human Services. Graduates will be prepared for employment within social service organizations, hospitals,

programs for the elderly, and community mental health centers. Graduates will be qualified to apply for the Mental Health Rehabilitation Technician/Community (MHRT/C certification offered through the State of Maine.

Graduates of the certificate program will meet the requirements for certification as a MHRT/C. This allows the graduate to work as an entry-level health practitioner.

The Substance Abuse Rehabilitation Technician Certificate provides the necessary course work for individuals who are interested in becoming substance abuse counselors. Courses are designed to provide students with an understanding of substance use, abuse and addiction in addition to rehabilitation and counseling strategies. Students will become proficient in interviewing, assessment, group facilitation, and other skills necessary to provide individual or group counseling services.

KEY LEARNING OBJECTIVES

Graduates with the associate in applied science degree in Human Services will:

- demonstrate knowledge of current principles of elementary counseling necessary to engage and interact with clients and their families while being sensitive to diversity and culture;
- engage in professional behaviors including: confidentiality, ethical practices and remaining professionally competent;
- apply strategies that support empowerment and choice for clients utilizing formal and informal supports in the community; and
- analyze problems that occur when working with clients and collaborate with team members to develop interventions and supports to address these challenges.
