Responsibilities: The Simulation Laboratory Specialist/ Manager has overall responsibility for maintaining the simulation labs at the Bangor campus and supporting EMCC simulations offered at Northern Light Eastern Maine Medical Center. Duties include working collaboratively with the nursing faculty to enhance student learning, maintaining equipment, ordering supplies, running simulations with high- and mid-fidelity manikins and standardized patients, creating simulations, and maintaining the supply stock for the labs. This position is an academic year position (43 weeks/year @ 40 hours/week; typically, the 2nd week of August through the first week of June).

Minimum Qualifications: Bachelor's degree in Nursing, or healthcare. Active professional licensure in the State of Maine, such as RN, NP, or PA required. Minimum of one year working with simulation in an educational institution or equivalent setting; working knowledge of high-fidelity manikins used in simulation; five or more years of experience working as a healthcare.

Preferred Knowledge, Skills and Abilities: Ability to work independently and as a part of a team; IT skills involving software and hardware. Experience working with faculty to develop and implement simulation scenarios
