### Off-Campus Resources

#### **Law Enforcement**

You may contact local law enforcement directly or ask EMCC staff to help you coordinate contact or support you through that process. The Title IX Coordinator will help you contact the local police so they can send an officer to initiate a report.

To contact law enforcement directly, you can call 911 if you are in an emergency situation, or you can call your local police for the town in which the assault occurred.

# **Maine Coalition Against Sexual Assault**

### **Hospitals**

To seek immediate medical attention or to request that physical evidence be collected in case you wish to file a police report now or in the future, you can go directly to one of the area's hospitals. However, you may wish to call in advance to confirm that a trained Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner(SANE) is on duty. MECASA can also help you find the closest hospital with a SANE on duty.

We make every effort to keep your report confidential and provide you with options. However, EMCC staff, are identified as mandated reporters. That means we have to follow Maine state

reporting laws. If we think you are under 18 and you tell us any information that makes us think you are being abused or neglected, we may have to share this with other adults to help keep you safe.

The College Counselor is a **Confidential Resource Advisor** who can provide confidential assistance and counseling.
