





Housing Eligibility

To be eligible for campus housing, students must:

- Be enrolled as a full-time student at EMCC (12+ credits per semester)

 Exceptions may be made for special circumstances
- Have a completed FAFSA and any documentation needed to process financial aid on file with EMCC or have submitted proof of third-party funding to cover expenses
- Pay a \$100 housing deposit or request a waiver of the deposit from the Residential Life Department
- Agree to abide by all EMCC policies and procedures including, but not limited to, the EMCC Civility Statement, Code of Conduct, and Chemical-Free policies
- Submit immunization records to vax@emcc.edu (as required by Maine Law).

- Have no outstanding balance with EMCC and agree to make payment arrangements for all charges (room, board, tuition & fees) prior to moving onto campus

*Housing assignments are made on a first-come, first-served basis after students have submitted all required information and taken care of their housing deposits.

Our Residence Halls

Both of our residence halls are **chemical-free** and are **locked 24 hours a day for resident safety**. In addition, the Residential Life team consists of professional staff members as well as trained student staff members, most of whom live on campus in the residence halls. The trained Resident Assistants who live on each floor will supervise residents, monitor the security of the building, and provide programming and activities.

Both halls have wireless internet; *FREE* on-site laundry; mail service; vending machines and common rooms with flat-screen TVs, microwaves, game tables and other amenities such as game and surround sound systems.



Kineo Hall

Kineo Hall houses students in "blocks" (two double-occupancy rooms with four people of the same gender) or triple-occupancy rooms. Each is individually climate controlled and shares a common bathroom with double sinks, a shower, and a toilet stall. All rooms in Kineo Hall have two of the following:

- Extra long twin beds (can be lofted higher or lowered, depending on the resident's preference)
- Armoires with hanging space and two drawers
- Desks with wooden chairs

Studies show that students that live on campus have higher GPAs, are more likely to complete their education, and as a whole, get more out of their college experience.

When you reside on-campus, there is always someone around and something to do. You have easy access to Student Services and form strong friendships with other students.



Acadia Hall

Acadia Hall houses students in corridor-style double or tripleoccupancy rooms. Floors are usually single-sex communities and have bathrooms on each floor that are cleaned and maintained by housekeeping staff.

All rooms in Acadia Hall have two of the following:

- Extra long twin beds (can be lofted higher or lowered, depending on the resident's preference)
- Dressers
- Desks with wooden chairs
- Built-in closet with shelf
- Microfridge
 A limited number of all-in-one microwave/freezer/ mini-fridge units are available for lease. These units also include 2 USB ports and can be paid for using financial aid. (\$200 per year).

Gender Inclusive Housing (GIH) This community allows students to choose a roommate regardless of sex, gender identity, or gender expression. Students who want to live in the GIH community must fill out their housing application or housing renewal forms accordingly. Those students need to sign up with a roommate or be open to rooming with an individual of any gender.

Dining Services & Meal Plans

EMCC contracts FLIK Dining Services to provide meal service to the College community. All students residing on campus are required to have a 5-day or 7-day meal plan.

Students with 5 day meal plans can still purchase meals over the weekend if needed and can pay with cash or a card at McCorkill Dining Hall.

All residential students must select a meal plan.

Meal plan options are as follows:

7 DAY (GOLD PLAN) \$3,361/semester 3 meals/day Mon-Fri 2 meals/day Sat & Sun 5 DAY (SILVER PLAN) \$2,740/semester

3 meals/day Mon-Fri No weekend meals

Additional Charges On-Campus residents will be charged a \$50 security deposit to cover room/building damages. In addition, a \$65 activity fee is charged each semester which allows Residential Staff to provide fun and engaging events and programs throughout the semester.
